India: Development and implementation of the integrated Manas Tiger Conservation Project with focus on socio-economic surveys and participatory approaches to develop sustainable livelihoods and conservation education within a Bengal tiger conservation project in Assam (Aaranyak).

Nepal: Securing of a long-term coexistence of farmers and large herbivores (Asian elephants and Greater one-horned rhinos) as well as large predators (leopards and tigers) in the vicinity of national parks in the lowlands of Nepal, through education, sustainable livelihood development (e.g. fostering the cultivation of medicinal and aromatic crops) and other human-wildlife conflict mitigation strategies (National Trust for Nature Conservation).
